#### COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

A lot has happened in the life of Good Shepherd since my last letter. We have said good-bye to Pastor Karen as she moves into another phase of her life. I would like to thank her for all the support she has given during this transition time. We have all enjoyed her sermons each Sunday, especially, her children's sermons that actually spoke to every member of the congregation. Her Bible studies were enjoyed by many as they gathered each Tuesday to study and learn together. Last but not least, we thank her for the time she spent with counseling and visiting the members who so needed her. Thank you to Pastor Karen and Godspeed as you leave Good Shepherd.

A Call Committee has been named and will start the search for our next pastor in the near future after doing some study and research on the needs of the church. They are Don Caughman, Cheryl Beaman, Phil Tollison, Greg Sox and Amanda Snodgrass. Bruce Shealy and Elizabeth Whitlow will serve as alternates to the Call Committee. We ask that the Holy Spirit work in and thru this committee to discern and find the person God will lead us to call.

The Church Council in conjunction with the South Carolina Synod will work together in a program called CTI, Consultation and Training Institute. What is its mission? "The mission of the program is to offer professional and skill based training and consultation aimed at assisting groups in developing competent and effective leadership, evaluation of organizational structures, developing mission statements, and setting clear goals." Dr. Bill Mitcham will work with our Council and a Transition Team to accomplish several goals. This program is designed to rebuild following a Congregational Crisis, develop a Mission Statement and set goals for the future. It will also foster effective leadership training, teach Team Building and conflict resolution. The program will kick off on May 3rd with your Council attending a retreat to better understand the program and its goals. After this retreat, Council in conjunction with Pastor Mitcham will identify several people to work with him to discern the needs of the church and to give the Call Committee some information gathered from the profile sheets submitted at the meeting in the FAB on February 25th. May the Holy Spirit work with and thru this group to strengthen Good Shepherd for the days ahead.

As we continue to move forward, we will have Supply Pastors working with us until such time as we have secured a new interim. I am working with Bishop Herman Yoos to secure a new interim for Good Shepherd and hope that one may be in place soon.

We also welcome, Elaine Granger as our new Parish Coordinator. Come by the Church Office and meet Elaine.

I look forward to the days ahead for our church and its members. Remember to be patient and let the Holy Spirit work in and thru each and everyone of us for the continued success of Good Shepherd in this community and in the world.

#### SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE SET

As we prepare for the summer, we have heard many express their appreciation for coming together for one worship service during the vacation months as we had done in the past. Therefore, again this summer we will observe a summer worship schedule. Beginning June 3rd thru August 19th, one unified worship service will be held in the sanctuary at 9:30 a.m. each Sunday. Sunday School will follow for all ages.

Also, again this summer a worship opportunity will be observed on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary, beginning June 6th thru August 15th. These will include a variety of reflective, prayerful services – a Healing Service with Communion, Taize, Compline and Intercessory Prayer Services.

A Service of Healing is not necessarily a service of curing, but it provides an atmosphere in which healing can happen. When this happens, physical healing sometimes occurs, mental and emotional balance is often restored, spiritual health is enhanced and relationships are healed. For the Christian the basic purpose of spiritual healing is to renew and strengthen one's relationship with the living Christ. Many find not only prayer but also Holy Communion, laying on of hands, and anointing with oil to be healing. Look for the Healing Service in our ELW, page 276.

A Taize Service involves sung and chanted prayers, meditation, a period of silence, and liturgical readings. This style of Christian worship is practiced by the ecumenical Taizé community in France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world and is characterized by the repetitive singing of simple harmonized tunes, often in various languages, interspersed with readings, prayers, and periods of silence. Look for Taizanian hymns in our ELW.

A Compline Service, also known as Complin, Night Prayer, or the Prayers at the End of the Day, is the final church service of the day in the Christian tradition of canonical hours. Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, Lutheran and certain other Christian denominations with liturgical traditions hold Compline services. They tend to be contemplative services that emphasize spiritual peace. Look for the Order for Compline in our ELW, page 320.

An Intercessory Prayer Service is committed to fostering a greater emphasis on personal and corporate prayer in the life of a believer and the church. It is prayer that pleads with God for your needs and the needs of others. An intercessor takes the place of another, pleading another's case. Intercessory prayer has been defined as "holy, believing, persevering praying."

So, make plans for the summer. Enjoy your vacation! But, ALSO MAKE PLANS TO ENJOY and TO JOIN TOGETHER FOR OUR UNIFYING OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORSHIP!!

#### **LECTIONARY FOR MAY 2018**

#### May 6 - Sixth Sunday of Easter

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

#### First Reading: Acts 10:44-48

While Peter shares the good news of Jesus with a Gentile soldier and his family, the Holy Spirit comes upon them. Recognizing that the Spirit works inclusively in the lives of both Jews and Gentiles, Peter commands that these Gentiles also be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

#### Psalm 98

Shout with joy to the LORD, all you lands. (Ps. 98:4)

#### Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6

God's children believe that Jesus is the Messiah and love God by keeping God's commandments. Thus the world is conquered not through military might but through love and faith.

#### Gospel: John 15:9-17

On the night of his arrest, Jesus delivers a final testimony to his disciples to help them in the days ahead. Here, he repeats the most important of all his commands, that they love one another.

#### May 13 - Seventh Sunday of Easter

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!

#### First Reading: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

In the days between Jesus' ascension and Pentecost, Peter oversees the process whereby one of the members of the community of believers is chosen to be the twelfth apostle, in order to fill the vacancy created by Judas's treachery and death.

#### Psalm: Psalm 1

The LORD knows the way of the righteous. (Ps. 1:6)

#### Second Reading: 1 John 5:9-13

God has borne witness to the gift of eternal life in Jesus Christ. Whoever believes in the Son of God believes in the witness of God and has the promise of eternal life.

#### **Gospel: John 17:6-19**

In this reading the church hears Jesus' words on the night before his death. This gospel reports the words of Jesus' prayer, a prayer for his disciples and for all who would believe in him through their words.

#### May 20 - Day of Pentecost

On the fiftieth day of Easter we celebrate the Spirit, through whom and in whom the people of God are created and re-created. Pentecost is sometimes called the church's birthday, but might more appropriately be

called its baptism day, since the gift of the Spirit is the fullness of baptism. Ezekiel's vision shows the Spirit resurrecting and re-creating not just individuals but a whole people. Romans makes it clear that God is in the process of re-creating the entire cosmos; yet the Spirit is also at work in the most intimate and personal way, praying in us "with sighs too deep for words" when we do not know how to pray.

#### First Reading: Acts 2:1-21

Originally Pentecost was a Jewish thanksgiving-type festival celebrated seven weeks after Passover. On this particular Pentecost, however, the Holy Spirit is poured out upon the entire community of believers just as Jesus had promised and the scriptures had prophesied. Empowered by the Spirit, the entire community bears witness to God's activity in multiple languages.

#### Psalm: Psalm 104:24-34, 35b

Send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth. (Ps. 104:30)

#### Second Reading: Romans 8:22-27

By pouring the Holy Spirit into our hearts, God gives us the promised first fruit of eternal life so that we await God's future in hope. In the meantime, the Spirit also intercedes for us by carrying the prayers of our weak human hearts to God.

#### Gospel: John 15:26-27; 16:4b-15

When speaking to his disciples before his death, Jesus referred to the Holy Spirit as "the Helper" and described the difference the Spirit would make in their lives and in the world.

#### May 27 - The Holy Trinity

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

#### First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

This reading narrates Isaiah's vision of the Lord surrounded by angels. They sing "Holy, holy, holy," a song the church sings at the beginning of the great thanksgiving. This liturgical text invites the church and all creation to sing in praise of God's glory. That glory is God's mercy toward sinners.

#### Psalm: Psalm 29

Worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness. (Ps. 29:2)

#### Second Reading: Romans 8:12-17

In describing the new life of faith, Paul refers to all three persons of the Trinity: the Spirit leads us to recognize that we are children of God the Father and sisters and brothers with Christ the Son.

#### Gospel: John 3:1-17

Jesus' miracles prompt Nicodemus to visit him in secrecy. Jesus tells him about being born of the Spirit and about the Son who has been sent by God to save.
